What is a Nurse Practitioner?

A Nurse Practitioner (NP) is a Registered Nurse (RN) with advanced training and skills.

What can a Nurse Practitioner do?

In addition to the work of the RN, the NP can:

- diagnose and treat common medical disorders
- order and interpret diagnostic tests
- prescribe medications
- Diagnose and monitor chronic illnesses
- perform minor procedures—Wart treatment, mole excision, sutures, pap tests etc.

Could a Nurse Practitioner help me?

A NP is educated to provide care for many illnesses and conditions. If your care is beyond the NP’s scope of practice, you will be referred to a general practitioner or specialist physician. NPs and physicians work together as a team to provide you with comprehensive care.
