CORE FUNCTION: To promote the mental, emotional and social health and well-being of Saskatoon

Community Clinic patients. To do this through referral, education, advocacy, community action, connecting clients to cultural services and resources, counselling, and program

leadership.

**DUTIES:** 

• Takes responsibility as primary case manager for clients.

- Interviews clients and assesses personal, family, social, and employment functioning relevant to the problems and symptoms presented. Assesses social and other environmental conditions.
- Determines a service plan and facilitates it through: referral, group treatment, connecting clients to cultural services and resources, environmental change and counselling. Monitors and follows-up on client progress.
- Works in collaboration with other health care workers in planning and service provision.
- Refers clients to appropriate community agencies and services for assistance in improving personal, social and vocational functioning and for practical help.
- Provides crisis and ongoing counselling.
- Treats clients' emotional, psychological, and relationship difficulties using a range of counselling models and methods.
- Other duties outlined in the job description.

## QUALIFICATIONS:

- B.S.W., or equivalent in training, formal education, and experience.
- Eligible for registration in a professional association and eligible for liability insurance.
- Three years' experience as a social worker, preferably in a health care setting.
- Significant training in a broad range of casework skills, including crisis and ongoing counselling.
- Demonstrated ability to work as a self-directed independent social worker within a multidisciplinary health care team.
- Knowledge and understanding of the general determinants of health and the effects of addictions and poverty.
- Must have a strong familiarity and understanding of Indigenous cultures.
- Fluency in an Indigenous language is an asset.
- Good oral and written communication skills.
- Interest and skill in community development an asset.
- Computer knowledge and skills are an asset.
- Compatibility with the philosophy and policies of the Community Clinic.
- Must be bondable.
- Demonstrates strong interpersonal and collaborative communication skills and attitude.
